AMENDMENT OF CHARTER

This Instrument Witnesseth That the Board of Regents for and on behalf of the Education Department of the State of New York at their meeting of September 10, 2019,

An application having been made by and on behalf of the trustees of The Foundation Center, for an amendment of its charter, it was

Voted, that the provisional charter of The Foundation Center, located in the city, county, and state of New York, which was granted by action of the Board of Regents under the corporate name "The Foundation Library Center" on May 25, 1956; was made absolute on November 21, 1958; amended on December 20, 1968 to include a name change to "The Foundation Center" be, and the same hereby is, amended to change the corporate name to "Candid" and to revise the corporate purposes to read as follows:

- a. To assemble, catalogue, and maintain a library or libraries, open to the public, relating to philanthropy and the nonprofit sector;
- b. To collect, organize, and make available to the public in the corporation's library or libraries and elsewhere reports and information about foundations and nonprofit organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, scientific, literary, or educational purposes;
- c. To promote the development and maintenance of sound standards for reporting by such foundations and nonprofit organizations to assist them in making such reports available to the public through the use of the corporation's library or libraries and in other ways;
- d. To aid and promote, in any and all lawful ways, the preparation and dissemination of reports to the public by such organizations;
- e. If and to the extent deemed advisable by its board of trustees, to compile and publish periodically a general directory of foundations and nonprofit organizations, newsletters, reports or other publications concerning them; and
- f. To study and give counsel on the organization, management, and programming of such foundations and nonprofit organizations.

and to add the following language:

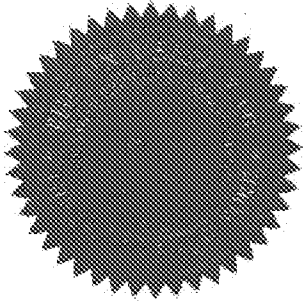
The corporation shall be a nonstock corporation organized and operated exclusively for educational purposes, as defined in section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future Federal tax code), and no part of the net earnings or net income shall inure to the benefit of any member, trustee, director or officer of the corporation, or any private individual (except that reasonable compensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the corporation), and no member, trustee, director or officer of the corporation, or any private individual, shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corporate assets upon dissolution of the corporation.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation

exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future Federal tax code) or by (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).


No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be devoted to carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation (except to the extent authorized by Internal Revenue Code section 501(h) as amended, or the corresponding provision of any future Federal tax code, during any fiscal year or years in which the corporation has chosen to utilize the benefits authorized by the statutory provision), and the corporation shall not participate in or intervene (including the publishing or distribution of statements) in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

Upon dissolution of the corporation, the board of trustees shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of the remaining assets of the corporation exclusively for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future Federal tax code), or shall distribute the same to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by order of the Supreme Court of the State of New York in the judicial district where the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, organized and operated exclusively for such purposes, as said Court shall determine.
