THIS MATTER comes before the court for entry of a Judgment dissolving the parties' marriage. Hereinafter, Petitioner shall be referred to as "Husband" and Respondent shall be referred to as "Wife." 2 E. No domestic relations suits or petitions for support pursuant to ORS
3 108.110 involving the marriage of Husband and Wife are pending in any other court in
4 the State of Oregon or any other state.

5 F. Respondent accepted service of a copy of the Summons and Petition filed
6 herein.

7 G. Wife is not now pregnant.

8 H. For a period of six (6) months immediately prior to the filing of this petition,
9 Husband and Wife continuously were, and now are, residents and domiciliaries of the
10 State of Oregon.

11 I. There are three children as issue of this marriage. All children are legal
12 adults not subject to the jurisdiction of the court.

13 J. This marriage should be dissolved and Husband and Wife should be
14 granted the relief hereinafter set forth.

15 K. Pursuant to ORS 107.065, the ninety-day waiting period has been waived.
16 The basis for the waiver is necessity in that this judgment provides for the family home
17 to be awarded to Husband, and Husband is to assume individually the joint debt of the
18 parties. A delay in the entry of this judgment would only serve to delay the achievement
19 of these goals.

24 whether or not equal, is just and proper under all circumstances. The parties intend this
25 Stipulated Judgment of Dissolution of Marriage ("Stipulated Judgment") to settle all
claims each may have had against the other prior to this Stipulated Judgment. The
parties warrant to each other and to this court that each has signed this Stipulated
Judgment of their own volition. The parties each acknowledge that they have been
adequately represented by counsel, or had the right to do so, during these proceedings

1 and fully understand their respective rights and liabilities. The terms of this Stipulated
2 Judgment represent a compromise of disputed issues in some instances. In addition,
3 each party acknowledges that there have been no representations or promises of any
4 kind which have been made to him or her as an inducement to enter into the agreement
5 represented by this Stipulated Judgment other than those expressly set forth.

6 2. This court accepts the representation made by both Husband and
7 Wife that they have disclosed all assets and obligations of the parties or of either of
8 them within their knowledge and that they have not unreasonably overstated or
9 understated the value of any asset or the amount of any obligation. They further warrant
10 that they have not transferred or placed in the hands of any other person under express
11 or implied agreement, trust, or understanding any asset of the parties without full
12 disclosure each to the other.

13 3. The parties desire by this agreement to make a permanent,
14 complete, and final adjustment and settlement between them of all issues in the above-
15 entitled proceeding and all of their legal rights and obligations to one another.

16 4. Respondent accepted service of true copies of the Summons and
17 Petition for Dissolution of Marriage on or about September 5, 2003.

18 It is now hereby ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that:

19 **EFFECTIVE DATE**

20 1. The marriage of the parties is dissolved effective upon the day the court
21 signs this decree.

22 **SPOUSAL SUPPORT/PROPERTY EQUALIZATION**

23 2. No spousal support is ordered. Respondent is granted judgment over
24 and against Petitioner in the amount of \$10,000.00, payable as follows: (i) \$7,500.00
25 payable within 7 days of the entry of the decree, and (ii) \$2,500.00 payable within 37

2 **HUSBAND'S SEPARATE PROPERTY**

3 3. Husband shall have as his sole and separate property, free and clear of any
4 right, title, interest, claim or demand of Wife:

5 a. All personal property in husband's name or possession and not
6 otherwise awarded by this judgment;

7 b. All of his tools of trade and the tools in the shop;

8 c. Vehicles:

- 9 i. 1930 Model A Ford;
10 ii. 1965 Chevrolet C-10;
11 iii. 1967 Ford Galaxy 500*;
12 iv. 1987 GMC C-20;
13 v. 1995 Chevrolet Suburban**; and
14 vi. All motorcycles.

15 *Petitioner shall pay to Respondent no later than January 15,
16 2004 the sum of \$2,350.00 for Respondent's interest in this
17 automobile.

18 **Regarding the 1995 Chevrolet Suburban, Petitioner is
19 awarded this vehicle. Respondent shall have the right to use
20 this vehicle until January 15, 2004. While using the vehicle,
21 Respondent shall insure and maintain the vehicle. Petitioner
22 shall timely make all installment payments owed on this
23 vehicle, even when Respondent has use of this vehicle.
24 Respondent shall return the vehicle to the family residence
25 on or before January 15, 2004.

18 d. 100% of the parties' membership interest in KORKERS PRODUCTS, LLC;

19 e. 100% of the parties' stock of KORKERS PRODUCTS A, INC.;

20 f. The personal property set out at Exhibit A attached hereto and by
21 this reference incorporated herein; and

22 g. All bank and/or credit union cards or accounts in Petitioner's name.

23 **WIFE'S SEPARATE PROPERTY**

24 4. Wife shall have as her sole and separate property, free and clear of any

2 a. All personal property in Wife's name or possession and not
3 otherwise awarded by this judgment;

6 this reference incorporated herein. Respondent shall remove the property listed on
7 Exhibit B no later than January 15, 2004; and

8 d. All bank and/or credit union cards or accounts in Wife's own name.

9 **REAL PROPERTY**

10 5. Petitioner is awarded solely the real property located at 10868 S. Mulino
11 Road, Canby, Oregon, whose legal description is:

12 A parcel of land situated in the Northeast one-quarter of
13 the Northeast one-quarter of Section 11, Township 4 South,
14 Range 1 East of the Willamette Meridian, in the county of
15 Clackamas and State of Oregon, described as follows:
16 Beginning at the Northeast corner of said Section 11; thence
17 West along the North line of said Section 11, a distance of
18 1326.80 feet to the Northwest corner of the Northeast one-
19 quarter of the Northeast one-quarter of said Section 11,
20 the true point of beginning of the parcel herein described;
21 thence south 00 degrees 06 feet 20 inches West along the
22 West line of the Northeast one-quarter of the Northeast
23 one-quarter of said Section 11, a distance of 600.00 feet
24 to a point in Milk Creek, passing through a 5/8 inch times
25 30 inch iron rod driven in the North bank of Milk Creek,
North 00 degrees 06 feet 20 inches East, a distance of
20 feet from said point; thence East a distance of 875.46
feet to a point in the center line of Market Road No. 25;
thence along a curve to the right having a radius of 5729.58
feet, an arc distance of 154.78 feet through a central angle
of 01 degrees 57 feet 56 inches West, a distance of 154.78
feet (County Road Station 144+22.77); thence North 36
degrees 11 feet 30 inches West along the center line of said
Market Road, a distance of 444.66 feet to a point of curve;
thence along a curve to the left having a radius of 286.48
feet, an arc distance of 269.04 feet to the North line of said
Section 11, through a central angle of 53 degrees 48 feet
30 inches, the long chord bears North 63 degrees 05 feet
45 inches West, a distance of 259.24 feet; thence West

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1 along the North line of said Section 11, a distance of 287.39
2 feet to the true point of beginning.

3 Petitioner shall assume and pay all debts secured by the real property:
4 taxes, promissory notes, mortgages or any other form of indebtedness secured by the
5 real property, holding Wife harmless therefrom. Petitioner shall rewrite or refinance the
6 debt so that Respondent is relieved of liability on these obligations, within nine months
7 after entry of this decree. The court retains jurisdiction of this case to enter further
8 orders if Petitioner is unsuccessful in terminating Respondent's personal liability for
9 debt secured by the real property.

10 Respondent may continue to occupy the family residence until September
11 17, 2003. At that time she will relocate and remove from the residence all property
12 listed on Exhibit B with the exception of the dining room set, oak entertainment center,
13 red hutch and two living room couches. Respondent will return to the residence only to
14 remove the remaining personal property or to return the Chevrolet Suburban to
15 Petitioner, or as agreed to by the parties. This shall occur on or before January 15,
16 2004.

17 **INDEBTEDNESS**

18 6. Each party shall pay the debts incurred by that party since August 1,
19 2003, and shall indemnify and hold the other party harmless from any such obligation. It
20 is presumed that the debts to be paid pursuant to the below listing are all of the parties'
21 joint obligations currently outstanding. Any individual debt not listed or provided for in
22 this judgment, whenever incurred, shall be paid by the party who created that debt and
23 that party shall indemnify and hold the other party harmless from any such obligation.

24 a. Husband shall assume, pay and hold Wife harmless from loss,
25 liability, injury, claim or demand on account of any indebtedness encumbering any asset
which by this Judgment becomes the sole and separate asset or property of Husband.

7-STIPULATED JUDGMENT OF DISSOLUTION OF MARRIAGE

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1 b. Wife shall assume, pay and hold Husband harmless from loss,
2 liability, injury, claim or demand on account of any indebtedness encumbering any asset
3 which by this Judgment becomes the sole and separate asset or property of Wife.

4 c. If either party fails to pay any debt or liability ordered by the court,
5 the other party should have the right, but not the obligation, to make any payments due.
6 If so paid, the defaulting party should be responsible for reimbursement and
7 indemnification to the party who made the payments, with interest computed at the
8 rate of nine percent (9%) per annum on the amount of any payment made. Interest
9 should accrue until the same is reimbursed in full.

10 d. Husband shall pay the following debts: Countrywide, Morgan &
11 Welch, all debt of "Korkers Products, LLC" or any of its predecessor companies, all
12 household utility bills, the gas company credit cards and the Oakheart Farms Visa.
13 Husband will pay the outstanding medical bills owed by the parties' adult son, Matt.
14 Husband shall assume the Shore Bank line of credit and assist in removing Wife's name
15 from that account.

16 e. Wife shall pay the following debts: Her own credit card debt
17 incurred since January 1, 1999, the Gateway computer account, the Bank of America
18 Visa, the Household Bank MasterCard. Wife shall pay her medical bills.

18 **ATTORNEY'S FEES AND COSTS**

19 7. Neither party is ordered to pay to the other party any sum on account of
20 the other party's attorney's fees or costs and disbursements incurred herein.

21 **INCOME TAX RETURNS**

22 8. For the years 2002 and 2003 the parties shall file income tax returns as
23 they may agree.

24 **INSTRUMENTS AND EXEMPTIONS**

25 8 - STIPULATED JUDGMENT OF DISSOLUTION OF MARRIAGE

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1 9. Each party shall sign, execute and deliver to the other party, or to the
2 person or agency designated by the other party, each document, writing or other
3 instrument necessary reasonably to effect of record changes in certificates of title or
4 other evidences of changes of ownership for allocation or apportionment of property
5 under this agreement.

6 a. Each party shall promptly deliver to the other party the personal
7 property to the possession or control of which the other party is entitled.

8 b. Compliance with the terms of this Section 9 shall be completed
9 within 30 days of the date of this judgment.

10 **NAME CHANGE**

11 10. Wife's name shall remain WORKMAN.

12 **MEDICAL/DENTAL INSURANCE FOR WIFE**

13 11. Wife, if she so desires, at no cost to Husband, shall remain insured under
14 Husband's group medical and dental insurance policies pursuant to the provisions of the
15 Consolidated Omnibus Reconciliation Act of 1985 (COBRA) and applicable state law, as
16 long as she has rights under said federal or state law.

17 Wife shall file all necessary documents or applications for continued
18 medical and dental insurance coverage. Wife shall be responsible for the payment of
19 medical and dental insurance premiums for the continuation of said medical and dental
20 insurance coverage.

21 **NECESSARY DOCUMENTS**

22 12. No later than thirty (30) days after entry of this Stipulated Judgment, each
23 party shall execute or cause to be executed whatever documents necessary to
24 accomplish the terms of this Stipulated Judgment. Each party shall transfer or cause to
25 be transferred all personal property awarded to the other party not later than thirty (30)

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1 days after entry of this Stipulated Judgment except that personal property the parties
2 have agreed Wife may leave in the home until January 15, 2004.

3 **EXCHANGE OF RECORDS**

4 13. Husband shall deliver to Wife within thirty (30) days after signing of this
5 Stipulated Judgment all documents and records in his possession or control relating to
6 all assets awarded to Wife in this Stipulated Judgment. Wife shall deliver to Husband
7 within thirty (30) days after signing of this Stipulated Judgment all documents and
8 records in her possession or control relating to all assets awarded to Husband herein.
9 This provision is not intended to require either party to return to the other party
10 documents produced during the pendency of the dissolution of marriage proceeding.

11 **NONUSE OF OTHER'S CREDIT**

12 14. Neither Husband nor Wife shall incur any debts or obligations upon the
13 credit of the other, and each shall indemnify, defend, and hold the other absolutely
14 harmless from any debt or obligation so charged or otherwise incurred.

15 **INDEMNITY**

16 15. Each party promises to indemnify the other from any obligation assigned to
17 him or her in this Agreement. Indemnification shall be construed to provide maximum
18 protection to the indemnified party, so that the indemnifying party shall at all times
19 assume full liability for and hold the other party harmless from all losses, damages,
20 costs, charges, fees (including, but not limited to, attorney fees), penalties or expenses
21 associated with the obligation.

22 **INTEGRATION**

23 16. This Agreement sets forth the entire agreement between the parties. All
24 prior agreements or representations, whether express or implied, oral or written, are
25 either incorporated into this Agreement, or are waived.

1 **APPLICABLE LAW**

2 17. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the state
3 of Oregon.

4 **BINDING ON THE SUCCESSORS**

5 18. Each and every provision of this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of
6 and shall be binding upon the heirs, assigns, personal representatives and all the
7 successors in interest of the parties.

8 **DEATH OR NONPERFORMANCE OF EITHER PARTY**

9 19. Should either party die before executing or fail to execute any document
10 under paragraph 12, this Agreement may be submitted in lieu of the necessary
11 document.

12 **WAIVER OF BREACH/MODIFICATION**

13 20. If either party fails to insist upon strict compliance of any terms of this
14 Agreement, that party may still insist on future compliance, and that party has not waived
15 any rights under this Agreement. No modification of this Agreement shall be binding on
16 either of the parties, unless the modification is in writing and signed by the parties or
17 ordered by the court.

18 **LITIGATION**

19 21. If any suit (except for the pending domestic relations suit), or other
20 proceeding or appeal is instituted to establish, obtain or enforce any right resulting from
21 this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to recover from the other party, in
22 addition to costs and disbursements, such additional sums as the court may find as
23 reasonable attorney fees, both in the trial and appellate court.

24 **ENFORCEMENT OF THIS STIPULATED JUDGMENT**

25 22. Each party is ordered to comply with all of the provisions of this Stipulated

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1 Judgment. In the event either party does not fulfill all or any of his or her obligations
2 strictly in accordance with this Stipulated Judgment, if the matter is placed in the hands
3 of an attorney for enforcement, even though no suit or action is filed, the predominately
4 prevailing party shall be entitled to receive his or her attorney fees and costs and
5 paralegal fees in addition to any remedy provided by law or equity. If a suit, proceeding,
6 or action is filed and tried, heard, or decided, the amount of such attorney fees and
7 paralegal costs shall be fixed by the arbitrator, court, or courts in which the suit,
8 proceeding, or action, including any appeal, is tried, heard, or decided.

9 **ADEQUATE REPRESENTATION**

10 23. Husband and Wife acknowledge that they have been adequately
11 represented by counsel, or had the right to do so, during these proceedings and fully
12 understand their rights and liabilities.

13 **MUTUAL RELEASE**

14 24. Each party releases, waives, and relinquishes all claims and rights he or
15 she has, may now have, or may hereafter have against the other or his or her estate as a
16 result of the marriage of the parties. This release applies to all claims and rights in all
17 civil proceedings of any nature including claims based on the acts or omissions of either
18 party through the date of the parties' divorce **except** for: (1) any claims either party
19 may have as to the enforcement of the terms of this Stipulated Judgment; and (2) any
20 claims either party may have against the other pursuant to ORS 107.452 or any
21 successor statute for an inadvertent or intentional failure to disclose significant assets
22 belonging to either or both of the parties on or before the date on which the parties
23 signed this Stipulated Judgment.

24 **CONTINUING JURISDICTION OF THE COURT**

25 25. Each party agrees that the court in the above-entitled proceeding shall

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1 retain jurisdiction over them to enforce all of the provisions of this Stipulated Judgment.

2 **SEVERABILITY**

3 26. If the court concludes that any provision of this Stipulated Judgment is
4 invalid or unenforceable, that provision shall be severed from the remainder of this
5 Stipulated Judgment so as to avoid making the Stipulated Judgment invalid or
6 unenforceable as to the remainder of the Stipulated Judgment. All remaining provisions
7 of this Stipulated Judgment shall then continue in full force. If the court concludes that
8 any provision is invalid in its scope, such provision shall be valid to the extent of the
9 scope permitted by law.

10 **ORDER ALLOWING WITHDRAWAL OF ATTORNEYS**

11 27. It is ordered that the withdrawal of the attorneys of record is granted
12 effective sixty (60) days after the date of entry of this Stipulated Judgment. After that
13 date, all notices from the court and service of process shall be sent to the parties
14 directly.

15 **PARAGRAPH HEADINGS**

16 28. The headings of particular paragraphs are inserted only for convenience,
17 and are not a part of this Stipulated Judgment or a limitation of the scope of the
18 particular paragraph to which each refers.

19 **STIPULATION**

20 29. I sign this Stipulated Judgment on my own volition, with full knowledge of
21 the facts, and with full information as to my legal rights and liabilities. In some
22 instances, the terms of this Stipulated Judgment represent a compromise of disputed
23 issues. However, I believe the terms and conditions to be fair and reasonable under the
24 circumstances. I have read the Stipulated Judgment and agree that it accurately
25 reflects our agreement.
