1. The Articles of Domestication shall include:

NONPROFIT
ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
THE SALT LAKE TRIBUNE, INC.

The undersigned individual, acting as incorporator under the Utah Revised Nonprofit Corporation Act (the "Act"), adopts the following Articles of Incorporation.

ARTICLE I

The name of the corporation is THE SALT LAKE TRIBUNE, INC.

ARTICLE II

The corporation is a nonprofit corporation under the Act, organized for the public benefit. The corporation shall continue in existence perpetually unless dissolved pursuant to the Act.

ARTICLE III

The corporation is organized and shall be operated exclusively for charitable and educational purposes permitted by Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended ("IRC").

ARTICLE IV

Notwithstanding any other provision of these Articles of Incorporation, the corporation shall not carry on any activities not permitted to be carried on (i) by a corporation exempt from federal income taxation under IRC Section 501(c)(3) and (ii) by a corporation contributions to which are deductible under IRC Sections 170(c)(2), 2055(a)(2) and 2522(a)(2). No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of any private shareholder or individual. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be carrying on propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, except as may be permitted under IRC Section 501(h), and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements), any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

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ARTICLE V

Upon dissolution or final liquidation of the corporation, after the payment or provision for payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation, the remaining assets of the corporation shall be distributed to such organization or organizations that are then described in IRC Sections 501(c)(3), 170(c)(2), 2055(a)(2), and 2522(a)(2) as the board of directors shall determine.

ARTICLE VI

The corporation shall have no voting members.

ARTICLE VII

The corporation shall have no authority to issue capital stock.

The incorporator has obtained the consent of all directors named to serve. All directors of the corporation other than the initial directors shall be elected at the time, in the manner and for the terms to be set forth in the corporation's bylaws.

ARTICLE IX

No director or uncompensated officer shall be personally liable to the corporation for monetary damages for conduct as a director or officer, provided that this Article shall not eliminate or limit the liability of a director or officer for any act or omission for which such elimination of liability is not permitted under the Act. No amendment to the Act that further limits the acts or omissions for which elimination of liability is permitted shall affect the liability of a director or officer for any act or omission which occurs prior to the effective date of the amendment

ARTICLE X

The corporation shall indemnify to the fullest extent permitted by the Act any person who is made, or threatened to be made, a party to an action, suit, or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative, investigative, or otherwise (including an action, suit, or proceeding by or in the right of the corporation), by reason of the fact that the person is or was a director, officer, employee or agent of the corporation. The corporation shall pay for or reimburse the reasonable expenses incurred by a director in advance of the final disposition, provided that such director complies with the requirements of Section 16-6a-904 of the Act. No amendment to this Article that limits the corporation's obligation to indemnify any person shall have any effect on such obligation for any act or omission that occurs prior to the later of the effective date of the amendment or the date notice of the amendment is given to the person. This Article shall not be deemed exclusive of any other provisions for indemnification or advancement of expenses of directors, officers, employees, agent and fiduciaries that may be included in any statute, bylaw, agreement, general or specific action of the board of directors.

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ARTICLE XI

All references in these Articles of Incorporation to sections of the IRC or the Act shall be deemed to refer also to the corresponding provisions of any future Federal tax or Utah nonprofit corporation laws.


