## INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY CONVEYANCE AND ASSIGNMENT AGREEMENT

This Intellectual Property Conveyance and Assignment Agreement (this “Agreement”) is made and entered into as of February 6, 2024 (the “Effective Date”) by and between Wethersfield Foundation, Inc. (formerly known as Homeland Foundation, Incorporated) a New York not-for-profit corporation, (“Assignor”) and Wethersfield Institute (into which Wethersfield Institute for Catholic Thought, Inc. merged in August 2023) a New York not-for-profit corporation (“Assignee”) (Assignor and Assignee are collectively referred to as the “Parties”).

WHEREAS, Assignor is the owner of all right, title, and interest in and to certain registered and unregistered trademarks, trade names, service marks, fictitious business names, logos, and applications that are set forth on Schedule A hereto, including all common law rights therein and the goodwill associated therewith (the “Trademarks”), and certain copyrights and U.S. copyright applications and registrations therefor that are set forth on Schedule B hereto, including all common law rights therein (the “Copyrights”); and

WHEREAS, Assignor hereby assigns, conveys, and transfers, and agrees to assign, sell, convey, and transfer, all of Assignor’s right, title, and interest in and to the Trademarks and Copyrights, including those held by Assignor on behalf the Free America Foundation, to Assignee, and Assignee desires to receive and own all right, title, and interest in and to the Trademarks and Copyrights.

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

1. Assignment. Assignor does hereby irrevocably convey, transfer, assign, and deliver to Assignee, its successors and assigns, and Assignee accepts from Assignor, all of Assignor’s right, title, and interest in and to the Trademarks and Copyrights. Assignor further consents to recordation of this Agreement by Assignee, and Assignee agrees to record this Agreement, with the United States Patent and Trademark Office or successor offices.
2. Additional Documentation as Necessary. Assignor agrees to execute, at any time and from time to time upon the request of Assignee, such additional documents as Assignee reasonably requests or requires to register and otherwise give full effect to the rights of Assignee under this Agreement in and to the Trademarks and Copyrights, including all documents necessary to record in the name of Assignee the assignment of the Trademarks and Copyrights with the United States Patent and Trademark Office, United States Copyright Office, or successor offices, and all documents necessary to record any name change from Homeland Foundation Inc. to Wethersfield Foundation, Inc. if recordation of such name change is deemed to be necessary.
3. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the domestic laws of the State of New York, without giving effect to any choice of law or conflict of law provision or rule (whether of the State of New York or any other jurisdiction) that would cause the application of the laws of any jurisdiction other than the State of New York.



5. No Modifications. This Agreement may not be supplemented, altered, or modified in any manner except by a writing signed by both Parties hereto.
6. Successors and Assigns. This Agreement shall bind and shall inure to the benefit of the respective Parties and their assigns, transferees, and successors.
7. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, which executed signature pages may be transmitted electronically, each of which shall be deemed an original but both of which together will constitute one and the same instrument.




